Wrs. Sandy soil with some gravel; level land; forest trees, mainly pine, with some scrub oak.	Ccl. Generally sandy loam, with some patches of sandy soil and clay soil; generally gently sloping land, dotted with a few sandstone mounds; forest trees of pine and hardwoods.
Bgl. Sandy loam containing gravel; nearly level land; forest trees mostly scrub oak.	Mls. Light sandy soil; generally uneven rolling land, with hills of sandstone; forest trees of pine without hardwoods. Now quite generally bare of forest growth.
Agf. Gravelly loam containing considerable clay; level land; forest trees of dense hardwoods, hemlock and pine.	Ml. Clay loam, generally containing some small angular stones; gently sloping, well drained land; forest growth of dense hardwoods, hemlock and pine.
Am. Sandy loam containing some shaly; uneven land; forest trees, mainly dense scrub oak.	Mg. Generally this loam over gravel grading down into shaly; uneven ground; gently sloping land; forest trees of dense hardwoods, hemlock and some pine.
Cel. Clayey loam mixed with some boulders; hilly land containing some swamps and ponds; forest trees, dense hardwoods, hemlock and pine.	Agl. Clay and gravel grading into wet hard pan; nearly level land; forest trees not dense, mainly tamarack, some cedar, pine and hardwoods.
Clc. Loamy clay with very little stone; gently sloping well drained land; forest trees, dense hardwoods, hemlock and much pine.	Sw. Wet clay and sand with much humus muck and peat; flat undrained land; forest growth of tamarack, cedar and some hardwoods and herbaceous growth of sedge grass, cranberry and moss.
Kcl. Clay loam with some boulders; gently rolling land; forest trees of dense hardwoods, hemlock and pine.	Hgs. Sandy soil containing gravel and boulders; gently rolling and hilly lands; forest trees, mainly pine.
